Diocesan Partnership Suggested Roll-Out

STEP 1: RECRUIT

- Send a general email to parishes explaining the partnership (See page 6)
- Put an announcement in every parish bulletin (See page 10)
- Share the YDisciple explainer video on your social media with a social media post about the partnership (See "This Is YDisciple" video)
- Host an online information session with YDisciple staff
- Send an email to the same general email list following up after the online information session (See page 8)
- Follow up with a phone call to specific leaders that you think would be good candidates
- Inform your local Catholic paper/magazine

STEP 2: IF A PARISH EXPRESSES INTEREST

- You want your parishes to have buy-in to the discipleship model, not just a
 product. Have them watch the "Introduction to YDisciple" training videos, fill
 out their plan (see page 11), and submit it to you
- Once they have submitted a simple plan to you, send their contact information to us, and we will set up their subscription

STEP 3: LEAD YOUR LEADERS

Getting parishes to subscribe is just the first step. Parish leaders getting started in a small group discipleship model usually need a lot of support. Consider running a small group of parish leaders that meets monthly to discuss difficulties and successes. We suggest the "Discipleship 101 with Jim Beckman" course as fodder for discussion. Each episode also comes with processing activities.

Do not just pray for, but pray with your parish leaders. Host a day retreat for them in which you pray over them for the release of the Holy Spirit. YDisciple offers content and training, but even the best resource cannot replace the real action of the Holy Spirit.

IN WHAT CONTEXT DO YOU PLAN TO USE YDISCIPLE?				
WILL THIS MODEL REPLACE A CURRENT FORMATION MODEL, OR IT WILL BE A SUPPLEMENT?				
YDisciple is more than just a curriculum. It is a process of discipling teenagers in small group environments. While there is no one roadmap to do this, there are four 'Marks on the Map' that successful parishes have in common.				
1. PARTNER WITH PARENTS MAKE A LIST OF POTENTIAL "LEAD PARENTS" WHO WILL HELP BUILD SMALL GROUPS AND GET THE WORD OUT.				
2. ENGAGE FAITHFUL ADULTS				
MAKE A LIST OF ADULTS IN THE PARISH WHO WOULD BE GOOD SMALL GROUP MENTORS. THINK BEYOND JUST YOUNG ADULTS. YOU ARE LOOKING FOR PEOPLE WHO RELATE WELL WITH OTHERS, HAVE TIME, ARE TEACHABLE, AND ARE FAITHFUL TO THE TEACHING OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. (SEE "EXPECTATIONS OF AN ADULT MENTOR").
